You will be required to read two novels this summer:




Who Was Steve Irwin? by Dina Anastasio (assessment-project)


# #1. YOUR ASSIGNED FICTION SUMMER READING NOVEL & ASSIGNMENT:





-There will only be a project (worth 10 points) for this novel, not a test.


